

Music in Early Years

In Early Years, children are able to access musical learning and investigation at all times through continuous provision. Music is also taught discretely in Foundation Stage through singing sessions and the Charanga scheme where the children are introduced to the fundamental basis of **the interrelated dimensions of music: the pulse**. In Early Years, children are introduced to the basics of learning a **tuned instrument** (the glockenspiel). Drumming workshops for Foundation Stage are also run by our external drumming specialist, Billy.

Extra-Curricular

At CwR, **all** pupils meet together for weekly singing. This provides a wonderful sense of unity that connects our school and builds social bonds from Foundation Stage to Year 6. We have a large school choir who attend a variety of community concerts and events. The choir's performances culminate in the sensational Young Voices Concert at Sheffield Arena which we attend every year. Our school choir is inclusive and open to every child in KS2. At CwR we vehemently state that *'anyone can sing!'*
